STATUTORY ASSESSMENTS - KS2 SATs (YEAR 6s)

These statutory assessments take place from <u>Monday 13th May to Thursday 16th</u> <u>May 2024</u> and includes a Reading paper, Spelling, Punctation and Grammar, and 3 maths papers, which are spread over the four days. On these days, the Year 6's can come to school and have breakfast before they complete the tests.

MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK (MTC) (YEAR 4s)

The MTC takes place over a two-week period starting on Monday 3rd June. The test takes approximately 15 minutes and the children will have opportunities to practise beforehand. The sound check on TTRS also allows the children to practise the style of questions.

PHONICS SCREENING (YEAR 1s)

There is a phonics screening check for all Year 1 children, which takes places during the week beginning <u>Monday 10th June</u> and takes approximately 20 minutes.
