He or she will know your child's strengths and weaknesses, how they are progressing in school and whether this is in line with your child's classmates. You will find that if there are any concerns in school your child's teacher will usually approach you before you approach them.

You can also contact the school's Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENDCo), Sarah Ogden. She oversees the provision for children with special educational needs or disabilities in school and will speak to your child's teacher if you have any concerns.
